On Monday, September 15, 2014, a new incentive plan for WMS students will roll out in all classrooms. The WMS Discipline Committee has been hard at work putting together a plan of rewards for good demonstration of character and behaviors using staff and student input.

Mr. Richard Gehrman, chairman of the committee, unveiled the plan to teachers in a faculty meeting this week. Here is how the plan works:

Students earn WOW! stamps for exhibiting

good behavior and character in each of their classes. WOW! represents Waccamaw #One Wildcat and students can earn these stamps in their official WMS Agenda through practicing the behaviors desired by each of their teachers. These behaviors may vary from classroom to classroom, but could reflect such behaviors as:

Marching Band in the Pink with The Blues



This program is for you!

Brook green Gardens Zookeeper for a Day program is an exciting new program that gives guests age 12 and older a firsthand look at working in a zoo. Come spend the day helping zookeepers with their daily routine of feeding, cleaning, and animal care. Don't miss your chance to feed deer, prepare animal diets, and get your photo with a snake!

All about Zookgeper for a Day

What should I wear?

Zookeepers work in all weather conditions and so will you! Rain or shine, you will be outside so come dressed appropriately for the weather. A t-shirt and name tag will be provided for you. Please wear khakis or jeans. Shorts are permitted in the summer. You will be cleaning and getting dirty, so wear comfortable, closed-toed shoes. Flip flops and sandals are not allowed, as they are not safe for behind-the-scenes areas.

What should Ibring?

You should bring a water bottle. Lunch and a snack will be provided for you. You may also want to bring bug spray and sun screen. Bring a camera with you as there will be photo opportunities throughout the day!

What should I know about working with animals?

Though our animals are tolerant of human presence, they are still wild and can act unpredictably. It is very important to follow the instructions of the zookeeper you are shadowing. Only enter animal are as with the direction of a keeper. Always wait for instruction and authorization from a keeper before approaching any animals while participating in feeding and training them. Only touch animals when the keeper has given permission to do so. Please note that this program is an inside look at a zookeeper's job and limited animal handling will be involved.

Are there any requirements or restrictions to participating?

Guests are required to bring with them proof of a negative TB test within twelve months of their experience. Guests are expected to follow all rules and guidelines of the staff. Those that do not follow the rules will be asked to leave without a refund. Please note that our behind-the-scenes are as are not handicapped-accessible.
