Both applications require the student to upload an unofficial copy of their transcript and self-report their senior year coursework. Recommendation letters are not required for general admission to the University of South Carolina.

The application process for the Honors College has changed: the Honors College application will be submitted separately from the general admissions application. Students are prompted to apply if eligible. We highly encourage all students interested in the South Carolina Honors College to complete the general University of South Carolina application by October 15, 2017. This will give them a full month to complete the Honors College/Top Scholars application due November 15, 2017. The Honors College/Top Scholar review requires two recommendation letters and two essays.



What is VirtualSC?

- Supplemental program that offers courses for high school credit to students in grades 7-12.
 - Free-of-charge.
 - Not a school and does not issue credit or diplomas.
 - No limit to the number of courses per student.
 - Students must be enrolled in grades 7-12 in a South Carolina public, private, homeschool or adult education program.
 - Enrollment is based on a first-come, first served basis with priority enrollment for Juniors and Seniors.

Exploring World Languages in SC

- Middle School Level Course (6th, 7th, and 8th)
- One Semester/No Credit
- Students will be exposed to <u>5</u> languages and the experience of online learning while completing units in Spanish, German, Latin, French and Gullah.
- Students will also explore the connections between these languages and SC art, history, and economics.
- Summer 2017 and Summer 2018
- May offer for Spring 2018



Credit Recovery

- Students must Master (successfully complete) a CR course before a grade report can be issued.
- Grade report will indicate
 "Credit Recovery Complete"
 upon mastery of the CR
 course.
- Students who do not complete the course by the deadline at the end of the semester will receive "Credit Not Recovered" on the grade report.

VirtualSC Enrollments

- During the 2015-16 school year, we had a growth of 21 percent from last school year

Student Policies

Attendance Policy

 Students who do not work in a course for a 14- day period will be administratively dropped from their courses for an attendance policy violation. Counselors may request a reinstatement for their student; however, only one reinstatement per course, per semester is allowed.

Reinstatement Policy

Students who are withdrawn for any reason (except multiple Academic Integrity and/or Conduct violations) may request to be reinstated within seven (7) calendar days of the withdrawal. If the reinstatement is not requested within the seven (7) day period, the student may register for the course in the next enrollment session.

Student Policies

- Early Testing Policy
 - Students must meet ALL of the following criteria to take an exam early:
 - 80% or higher in the course.
 - No zeros on any assignments.
 - Permission from VSC teacher.
 - Permission from sponsoring school counselor.



Test Preparation

- VirtualSC offers test preparation free-of-charge to any student or teacher in the state of South Carolina whether they are enrolled in VirtualSC or not. These reviews were developed by Shmoop, a digital curriculum test preparation company that makes fun yet rigorous learning materials.

HOW TO APPLY

Complete the FAFSA: www.fafsa.gov

AGAIN THIS YEAR --- AVAILABLE OCTOBER 1, APPLY USING PRIOR-PRIOR YEAR DATA (2016)

Each year, the FAFSA must be <u>received</u> by the federal processor by <u>JUNE 30th</u>.

New FAFSA required by deadline every year.

Be sure to answer ALL residency questions.

Tuition Grants limited to four years.





STUDENT ELIGIBILITY

Based on Financial Need as calculated using FAFSA data (includes family income, family assets excluding home equity, family size, number in college at same time, cost of college attended) – Must meet all Federal aid eligibility requirements.

Must be South Carolina residents (parents of "dependent" students must be permanent South Carolina residents).

Grant awarded for 2 semesters. Must attend full-time and must attend Fall term. Not attending Fall term forfeits the Tuition Grant for the full year. Not available for Summer terms.

Eligibility restricted to first four-year degree.





ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

Incoming Freshmen must rank in top 75% of graduating class OR score 900 on SAT (Math and Evidence-based Reading and Writing Sections only) OR score 19 on ACT OR graduate from a SC high school with a final GPA of 2.0 on the SC Uniform Grading Policy.

Continuing students who enroll full-time for the Fall & Spring Terms must pass 24 credit hours per year <u>AND</u> meet the college's Federal Satisfactory Academic Progress Requirements. AP/Dual Enrollment credits from high school may count toward this requirement during the freshman year.





GRANT AMOUNTS FOR 2017-2018

Maximum Grants for 2017-2018 are set at \$3,200 at all eligible colleges.

The Commission will award almost \$40 million in 2017-2018 to over 13,800 students.

State Budget Request to increase Maximum Grant to \$3,350 in 2018-2019.





ELIGIBILITY NOTICES

Over 99% of students list a valid e-mail address on the FAFSA and are notified electronically.

Tentative Awards are made to the first eligible private college listed on the FAFSA, but can be transferred if the student decides to attend another eligible private college.

UPPERCLASSMEN MUST PASS A MINIMUM OF 24 CREDIT HOURS ANNUALLY

South Carolina Teaching Fellows Program



Mission

The mission of the South Carolina Teaching Fellows
Program is to recruit talented high school seniors
into the teaching profession and help them
develop leadership qualities.



Background

Each year, the program provides Fellowships for up to 200 high school seniors who have exhibited high academic achievement, a history of service to their school and community, and a desire to teach in South Carolina.



Preparation

Teaching Fellows participate in advanced enrichment programs at Teaching Fellows Institutions, have additional professional development opportunities, and are involved with communities and businesses throughout the state.



Fellowship

Teaching Fellows receive up to \$24,000, in yearly scholarships (up to \$6000 a year for four years) while they complete a degree leading to teacher licensure. A Fellow agrees to teach in South Carolina one year for every year he or she receives the Fellowship.

Interviews

- Interview in front of a team of 3 educators.
- Share a three minute presentation.
- Complete a writing prompt.

Timeline

- Application Open September 1 December 1, 2017
- References and Transcripts due- by 5:00 p.m. on December 8, 2017
- Applications Scored mid December 2017
- Letters mailed to all applicants mid January, 2018
- Interview Day February 17, 2018
- Awards Early spring, 2018



Final Thoughts

Plagiarism Screening Tool

Applications containing plagiarized responses will be eliminated and the student will not be eligible to receive a Teaching Fellows award.

Surety

Teaching Fellow awardees are required to identify a surety who is willing to cosign the promissory note.



Payback Provisions

Teaching Fellows agree to teach in a SC public school one year for every year they have accepted funds. Fellows have five years from graduation to complete this requirement. Students who do not graduate in good standing from the program or who do not teach in a SC public school are required to repay the amount the accepted plus interest.
