MINUTES
November 26, 2018

Items of business:

- October 2018 Minutes – Tiffani Lyles/Melissa Doolittle read minutes from our October 2018 meeting. Minutes were approved as is.
- November – look at report card but it hasn't been released. Scheduled to be released Thursday, November 29.
- SIC – look at goals
- ESSA Accountability Model Review/School Report Card Overview – Federal & State
 - Report Card Data – Explanation
 - 18 Year Accountability Model
 - 90% - College, Career, & Citizenship Ready
 - 90% - Graduation - 4 Years
 - 90% - score level 4 or higher, 70% score level 3 or higher
 - 70% English learners annual progress in English by end of 5th year in EL Program
 - EOC – English I, Biology I, Algebra I, US History – All used for accountability
 - Federal Requirement – all States must have College Ready Measures
 - 2016-2017 results reflect new cut scores in English I and Algebra I – 80/B is aligned to CCR (ACT 22-Math & 22-Reading)
 - 2017-2018 results in Biology I will be new cut scores – 80B is aligned to CCR (ACT 23 – Science)
 - Subgroups – must have 20 – does not impact rating but recorded
 - 5 ratings based on total points – Excellent; Good; Average; Below Average; Unsatisfactory
 - Accountability System = 100 Points
 - 60% - Academic: Achievement 25/30; Graduation Rate 25/30; English Proficiency 10%
 - 40% School Quality/Student Success
 - 5 ratings based on total points – Excellent; Good; Average; Below Average; Unsatisfactory
 - 1st Year – no target numbers – Schools will be given rates due to top 15%-Excellent, 20%-Good, 35%-Average, 20%-Below Average, 10%-Unsatisfactory. Unfortunately, someone will end up on the bottom.
 - Academic Achievement – Students meeting standards in Reading, Writing, and Math, compared to State.
 - Measuring student success from entrance to exit of high school
 - Last year's graduating class being reported
 - How do we get points? EOC: F-0, D-1, C-2, B-3, A-4
 - 2017 Baseline – Long term Goal 2035
 - Performance goals 1, 2, 3, & 4 set to reach long term
 - Academic Achievement Example shared
 - Look at data from last year for English I and Algebra I
 - Old model was about proficiency. Now we need to move towards moving each student up a level.
 - Preparing for Success Indicator – Science & Social Studies – Calculate on points
 - Cohort model – data used in report card rating is dead data – students that graduated in 2017-2018 took Algebra I and English I several years ago – concerning because not current data
 - Review data slides
 - Highest passing rate in US History in M-C history
 - Biology had few pass but more A/B

- College & Career Readiness – 25 Points – To be college-ready, a student must meet one of the following:
 - 20 or higher – ACT
 - 1020 or higher – SAT
 - 3 or higher – AP
 - 4 or higher – IB
 - 6 hours’ dual enrollment with a C or higher
 - ASVAB is a very good test
 - Only count students one time
 - Looked at achievement data 2017-2018: ACT Subtest, 11 Grade; SAT; WIN
 - English Learners 10 Points
 - Performance Goal 9 as written now: The percentage of students who graduate with a high school diploma with their class will increase from 88.8% in 2017 to 90.8% in 2023.
 - M-C had 95% take survey – School Quality
 - English language progress hard to track – some in and out before data collected
 - All data not received in timely manner and then must be tracked prior to reporting
 - Students who do not meet WIN requirements can take ASVAB to try and meet Career Ready status.
- Positive Share
 - Band Update – Jessica Bullard, Band Booster Club President:
 - High school and middle school band combined sold about \$20,000 in fruit. Fruit pick up will be Dec. 7th and 8th at the band room.
 - The next fundraiser will be a Tupperware fundraiser in February.
 - The winter concert will be a joint concert with Mid-Carolina Middle School at MCHS gym on December 20th at 6pm.
 - Newberry County Band Clinic will be January 18th & 19th and held at MCHS. There will be a concert at the conclusion of the clinic on the 19th.

 - Region Band Auditions will be held on January 12th at Woodruff High School. 50+ students from the middle school and high school are signed up to audition.
