it would revolutionize education in this country.” □**

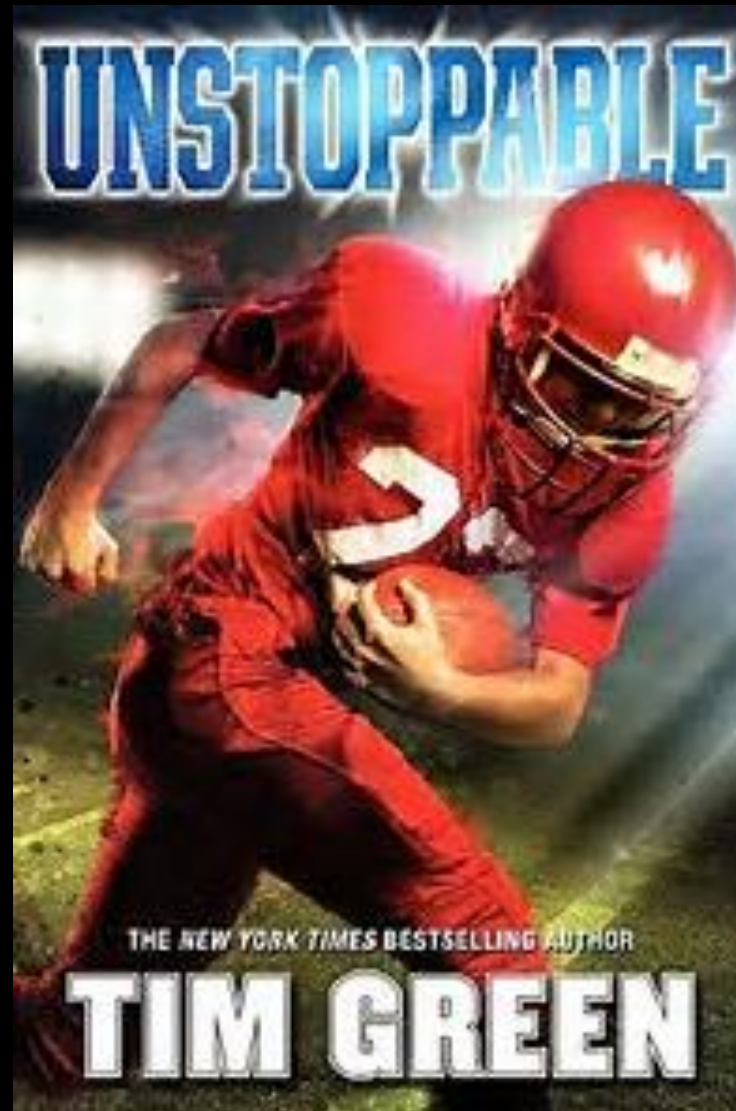

Read-aloud programs across the country have proven that reading to children from birth establishes foundational literacy skills by:

- Improving listening comprehension
 - Increasing vocabulary
 - Providing fluency models
- Promoting conceptual understanding
 - Lengthening attention spans
- Creating a positive attitude toward books and reading

ELA STANDARD

- Range and Complexity (RC)
 - Standard 13: Read independently and comprehend a variety of texts for the purposes of reading for enjoyment, acquiring new learning, and building stamina; reflect on and respond to increasingly complex text overtime.
 - 13.1- Engage in whole and small group reading with purpose and understanding through teacher modeling and gradual release of responsibility.
