Newberry High School students, staff, faculty, and our community annually celebrate survivors of breast cancer and raise money for breast cancer research and awareness. This year, the Pink Out fundraiser will run from October 1 to October 12.

Proceeds will go to the Susan G. Komen Foundation.

During our Pink Out fundraiser, we will decorate the campus and invite students to participate in a number of activities, including face-painting, sidewalk chalking, and special activities in the quad on Fridays, October 5 and 12. National Honor Society students will provide information about Pink Out in the mornings before school and at lunch at a Pink Out table.
