MAP

Measures of Academic Progress (MAP), developed by the Northwestern Evaluation Association (NWEA) is a computerized adaptive test. The difficulty of the test is adjusted to the student's performance based on how well the student has answered questions. MAP measures a student's progress and growth. It shows how your child has grown from one year to the next in reading, language usage and math skills. Teachers gain information on students' strengths and specific areas of weakness. Information in this document is based on NWEA's 2015 norms.

Fountas & Pinnell Text Level

Tasks from the Fountas & Pinnell Assessment in Reading are used at the elementary level to determine students instructional reading level. Teachers administer various tasks several times throughout the year and use the results to plan instruction.

Lexile Level

The Lexile scale is a developmental scale for reading that ranges from below 200 for beginning-reader material to above 1700 for advanced text. The range indicates the level of text that can be understood by the student 75% of the time. There is not a direct translation from a Lexile measure to a specific grade level. The Lexile measure indicates the level at which 50% of students at a particular grade level are reading. For more information, visit www.lexile.com.
