CAMS WRITING ACROSS THE CURRICULUM WEEK

The week of November 16-20 all CAMS students are involved in our first annual writing across the curriculum event. In ELA, math, science, and SS classes; students and teachers are engaging in subject specific texts and also writing in response to the texts. The new standards and curriculum in Tennessee requires that all learners are consistently exposed to high-level tasks. Students and teachers will discuss scoring of the writing pieces and each student has been trained on the rubrics for each subject. Data from these activities will be used to gauge all future instructional practices in this area.

At home, please encourage nightly reading. Research shows that just 4-6 minutes of extra reading makes a difference in developing on grade level reading ability. We're building reading and writing stamina, and we greatly need assistance from parents to make this work. The rigor of the new standards and new assessment requires 21st century teaching and learning for ALL stakeholders to "subvert the dominant paradigm." (GET OUT OF OUR OLD WAY OF THINKING.) Students are no longer just selecting a letter as an answer.
