

# Graduation Requirements

Below are the minimum 24 credits required for high school graduation.

## GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

English I, II, III, & IV	4 credits
<b>Mathematics</b> (Students must be enrolled in a math class every year of high school.)	4 credits
1 credit of Algebra I	
1 credit of Geometry	
1 credit of Algebra II	
1 credit of an upper level math	
<b>Science</b>	3 credits
1 credit of a lab science	
1 credit of Biology	
1 credit of Chemistry or Physics	
<b>Social Studies</b>	3 credits
1 credit of World Geography, World History, AP Human Geography	
1 credit of US History	
½ credit of Economics or Business Economics, or 1 credit of Marketing Education I	
½ credit of U.S. Government or American Bus. Legal Systems*	
<b>Wellness*</b> (½ credit of Health <b>AND</b> ½ credit of either PE or Physical Training)	1 credit
<b>Physical Activity*</b> (½ credit of either PE, Physical Training, S1 of Band, or Band Aux.)	½ credit
<b>Personal Finance*</b>	½ credit
<b>Foreign Language**</b> (Levels I and II of the same language)	2 credits
<b>Fine Arts**</b>	1 credit
<b>Computer Applications</b>	1 credit
<b>Program of Study</b> (3 credits must be attained from the same Program of Study)	3 credits
<b>Elective</b>	1 credit

\* Two (2) credits of JROTC replace 1 credit of Wellness requirement

ALSO Three (3) credits of JROTC replace ½ credit for Physical Activity, ½ credit of Personal Finance, and ½ credit US Government requirements.

\*\*Students who are NOT planning to attend college may replace the Foreign Language and Fine Art requirements with 3 additional credits that either expand the selected Program of Study or complete an additional Program of Study.

**SENIOR TOP TEN PERCENT:** To qualify for the Top 10% of the senior class, students must have passed at least one (1) honors course and at least one (1) AP course.

**TESTING REQUIREMENT:** The PLAN is required to be taken in the fall of the sophomore year. The ACT and the TCAP Writing Assessment are required to be taken during the junior year. End-of-Course tests are given in English I, English II, English III, Algebra I, Algebra II, Biology, Chemistry & US History. All EOC tests count as 25% of the second semester average
