The FHS Men's Soccer team kicked off their season with a district game against Forrest High School. The Tigers season was thwarted for several weeks by bad weather, cutting out the entire pre-season for the team. Nonetheless, the team started their season off right, making quick work of the Forrest Rockets, exploiting the Rockets high defensive line with crisp passes and swift runs. The Tigers, frustrated with their late start to the season, played with a ferocity and skill that vastly surpassed their performances last season, and shredded the Rockets defense, slotting 8 goals past the Forrest goal keeper. Drew Bradford, a junior who was awarded Offensive All District last season, was unstoppable, slipping in 4 goals and terrorizing the Rockets defense with his speed. John Strong, known affectionately as "JJ", scored a brilliant goal off of a corner kick, blasting the ball into the net past the helpless goal keeper. The two freshman on the team, Spencer King and Weston Moon, made impressive debuts for the squad, with Spencer grabbing 2 goals and Weston helping to keep the clean sheet for the Tigers at Center Back. Foreign exchange students Luiz Buzolin and Seth Thoomala also had fantastic performances, with Luiz locking down the sideline as a left Fullback, and Seth coming on as a substitute to score on a penalty kick.
