They will then read a second passage and answer a prompt comparing the two texts. Students have been working very hard in their ELA classes to prepare for this assessment. If you have additional

Happy Holidays!

The 7th grade scientist have been working hard: they have been learning all about prokaryote cells and eukaryote cells and their organelle. And, they have been working with microscopes to study organism and cells under magnification. At the end of November, they spent two days to the computer labs doing research for their 2nd quarter projects: they are so excited about presenting their projects before break.

Social Studies

The 7th grade is finishing up with work on Medieval Europe and reviewing now for the 2nd Quarter Finals. We have worked hard the last few months analyzing primary sources and maps to make meaning of world history issues like:

• "How did the Mongols get so powerful?"

- "Why did China isolate itself from the rest of the world after the Ming Dynasty?"
- "Why is the Shinto religion so important to the Japanese?"
- "How do the codes of chivalry and the Bushido (code for the samurai) compare?"
- "What was the Hundred Year War and who led The Crusades?"

Students have used textbooks, primary sources, and other resources to grapple with the question: "Were the Dark Ages really as dark as some historians reported?"

Students in 7th grade are working and thinking like historians.

Mr. Gordon and Mrs. Byars are excited about the newly adopted curriculum in world history. We look forward to moving into the Renaissance and Reformation when we return back from winter break.

Writing

In Writing class we are reading nonfiction texts, noticing text structure, determining importance, examining explicit and implicit relationships between ideas, and thinking about the author's purpose. Writers learned how to create an outline and use this plan to write an argument essay. Students learned the difference between reasons and evidence, how to write a strong thesis, and how to write a powerful conclusion.


