Dear Students and Parents,

This summer all rising 4th graders must read *The Lemonade War* by Jacqueline Davis.

The required novel provides an opportunity for fourth graders to share a common reading experience and serves as a jumping off point for classroom activities at the beginning of the school year.

All students will complete an in-class activity related to the book listed above during the first few weeks of the 2017-2018 school year.

In lieu of a second required text, all students are encouraged to study their multiplication facts from 0s to 10s throughout the summer.

Students should be prepared to complete an in-class activity to apply multiplication facts during the first few weeks of school.

Summer is a wonderful time to read for pleasure and enrichment. A suggested title list is included as one possible source of reading guidance in choosing additional books to explore beyond the required novel. Award-winning and "too good to miss" titles are included to appeal to the broad range of interests, maturity levels, and reading abilities of our students, with suggestions coming from students, teachers, and librarians.

Can students read books that are not listed here? OF COURSE! The important thing is to read, read, read!

We hope that summer reading will bring many hours of enjoyment and encourage the life-long love of reading!

How to Tell if a Book is Just Right for You

When you start to read a book, ask yourself three questions:

1. Can I understand it? 2. Can I talk about it? 3. Do I love it?

If you can say "yes" to all three questions, you should read the book! If you say "no" to one or more questions, it may be time to abandon the book and look for another one.
