## OHS Mobile Device Policy

## Flynn's Classroom Mobile Device Policy

Upon entering class, each student will place his/her mobile device in the designated slot. Each pocket will be numbered to keep track of whose device is missing and to prevent confusion when devices are dropped off and picked up. If a student is seen with a mobile device during instructional class time without permission, the device will be taken for the remainder of class on the first offense. Repeat offenses will result in the device turned in to the office for TEN DAYS.
