I and judges from LAUNCH will choose teams to compete in a finals competition on Thursday. The finals is open to the public and will be judged by business leaders from throughout Chattanooga. The SURGE Showcase is open to the public and will take place in the Bond Auditorium on the Chattanooga State campus at 2pm on Thursday, January 12th. We cannot wait to see and hear from our students on their amazing ideas, see their working prototypes, and hopefully crown a STEM School team as champion!

PBL Units

We are excited to kick start our PBL units for this spring with our 9th, 10th and 11th grade students.

- -9th graders are getting into full swing on their robotics unit. They are building out team contracts, setting up their timelines with the use of the unit pacing guide, and beginning to think about their robot build.
- -10th graders kicked off their Unum coding unit with an opportunity to "code" directions for staff makeup makeovers. I want to thank the 10th grade student experts for "selecting" me as a model. Let's just say it took me a good bit of time to remove my makeup. As for the coding unit this year, teams will be learning the programming language of Swift this year as they build out an iOS app using Xcode. Both the students and faculty are excited as this is the first year we have introduced Swift and Xcode in this PBL unit.
- -11th graders are starting into their PBL choice opportunities this next week. Opportunities this quarter include Chattanooga Design Studio open spaces project, Chattanooga Zoo snake exhibit enhancement, Kenco loading dock status tracker, Moon Pie 100th anniversary social media campaign, STEM School storage solution, TN Aquarium environmental terrain relief model, and Unum performance support tool.
