## Open House – Tuesday, September 19 from 6:30pm-8:15pm

Reminder: Our STEM School Open House will start at 6:30pm on Tuesday, September 19th. Open House is an opportunity for parents to learn more about your student's teachers and opportunities. Students are also welcome to attend. Please note that the evening will last just over 1.5 hours and our student leaders in Student Council design, organize and run the schedule for the evening.

In order for you to plan appropriately, here is what you need to know. Student Council expects parents to be here by 6:30pm. Parents will then be part of a schedule created by the Student Council for the next hour and a half to learn more about their student's STEM daily experience.

## Powerschool and GradeCraft - Grades

Both Powerschool and GradeCraft will be set up and operational by this upcoming Monday, September 18. Powerschool is used for reporting of all Learning Target and PBL grades in STEM classes except for science class. GradeCraft, in a partnership with the University of Michigan on gameful learning, is used for our science classes this year.

9th and 10th grade students will be given two letters regarding Powerschool access and logins on Monday. 11th and 12th grade students and parents should already have Powerschool access from last year. ## Chattanooga State Construction

There are three major projects taking place this year in or adjacent to the CETAS building for Chattanooga State.

- 1. Greenhouse The parking lot area that is fenced off is part of a construction project for a new state of the art greenhouse building. This project will last approximately six months and will impact our traffic pattern during that time.
- 2. CETAS Roofing The entire CETAS building (which includes the STEM School) is getting a new roof. The roofing during the school year will take place on the portion of CETAS not over the STEM School. However, this will most likely cause the fire alarm to trigger at random times due to dust. There should be no safety issue, but we will have to evacuate the building when an alarm is triggered just in case. Long story short, if your student says we seem to have an increased number of fire drills this year, they will be correct. As for the roof over the STEM School portion, that work will take place starting in June.
- 3. Engineering Facility Bay Doors There are a few engineering facility bay doors being added to the back of the engineering labs on the backside of CETAS. This work will have very little impact on our students. However, there will be some sound issues for students or classes that are using the outdoor classroom area.
