# 12th Grade ACT Retake Day on Tuesday, Oct 3

The Tennessee Department of Education offered seniors the opportunity to take an official ACT for free again on Tuesday, October 3. We are excited that most of our seniors have chosen to take advantage of this opportunity. All seniors participating will need to be at STEM by 8:40am that morning. Any senior participating should also email his/her college instructors prior to the testing time if the student is going to miss college class time. This is a great opportunity to raise a personal ACT score!

# FAFSA Night for 12th Grade Students and Parents on Tuesday, Oct 3 at 6pm

The FAFSA is needed in order to qualify for any federal money or scholarships. Parents should bring their tax documents with them. Parent and student should both be in attendance.
