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AALANA* EDUCATORS SCHOLARSHIP

About the Scholarship Fund

In an effort to support the mission of Hamilton County Schools and the Tennessee Department of Education to increase diversity in the education workforce, the Chattanooga Hamilton County Retired Teacher Association (CHCRTA) proposes a new scholarship. The scholarship criteria is objective and nondiscriminatory, but may be designated to benefit members of a minority group or a pool of individuals who meet criteria reasonably related to the charitable purposes of this scholarship. Treas. Reg. § 53.4945-4(b)(2).

CHCRTA is committed to awarding the first annual AALANA Educators Scholarship to a graduating member of the Class of 2018 attending a public school in Hamilton County, Tennessee. In 2018, the scholarship is a one-time award in the amount \$1,500 to a student who plans to pursue a career as an elementary or secondary school teacher in a public school in Hamilton County. The award will be sent to the college upon verification of college enrollment. The criteria, rubric, and other details are provided annually to HCDE School Counselors and HCDE College Advisors.

Scholarship Criteria

- Applications are accepted from any high school senior graduating, in good standing, in the Class of 2018 from a public school in Hamilton County. The applicant must have a cumulative GPA of at least 2.50, with equal consideration to all applicants meeting the GPA requirement.
- Applicants must demonstrate a desire to enter the teaching profession, preferably in Hamilton County.
- *Applicants eligible for this scholarship include African-American, Latino/Hispanic, Asian, and Native Americans = AALANA. Instead of using the term "minority student", the acronym AALANA is used when referring to students of color populations.
- Applicants must be accepted by and attend a regionally accredited, non-proprietary, community or four year college in the fall following his/her high school graduation.

In order to be considered for this scholarship, applicants must submit the application

along with the following information.

- An official high school transcript which includes cumulative GPA and ACT/SAT score(s).
- A typed two page essay (Essay details below.)
- One to two page resume, using a bullet point format. Include educational background, extra-curricular activities, work experience,
- community involvement, awards, accomplishments, etc. Examples of a 'bullet point resume format' are available on the Internet.
 One letter of recommendation from a classroom teacher, principal or school counselor who knows the applicant's academic ability, work ethic and character. The letter must be typed on the school's letterhead paper.

Student Essay

Essay Title: Select an experience from your own life, in a diverse society, and explain how this event influenced your decision to become a classroom teacher.

- Essay format: Double spaced, Times New Roman 11 or 12 point font, one-inch top, bottom, and side margins.
- Length: Approximately 500+ words, with a maximum length of two page typed essay.
- Compliance: No identifying information on the essay such as the name of the student's school, student's name, etc.
- Scoring Guide: Refer to the CHCRTA Scholarship Essay Rubric.

Mailing Instructions

- The scholarship application and supporting documents including the essay must arrive in one packet.
- Do not place the application in a special folder or staple documents together; use paper clips to keep materials in order.
- It is best to use an envelope that will hold the application without folding it, but not required.
- To be considered for the AALANA Educators Scholarship, mail the application in its entirety to the following address. The packet must be received by Thursday, April 12, 2018 at 5:00 pm. Emailed, faxed, late and/or incomplete applications will not be considered.

Selection and Presentation

- Recipients are selected by members of the CHCRTA Scholarship Committee; the decisions of the judges are final.
- If possible, the school with a scholarship recipient will be notified in time for the presentation of the scholarship on its Awards Day.
- A certificate will be presented on Awards Day or another designated time set by the high school faculty. If preferred, a representative from CHCRTA will gladly present the scholarship. The scholarship award will be sent to the college upon verification of college enrollment.
- The recipient of the scholarship and his or her parents or guardians will be invited to attend the CHCRTA meeting in August where he or she will be presented to the CHCRTA members.
