Counselling Update

- US Senate Youth Program: Applications are now being accepted from junior or senior high school students to be a participant in the United States Senate Youth Program. Two Tennessee delegates will participate in an annual March Washington Week which includes a variety of events that promote a unique understanding of the structure of our national government. The Hearst Foundation also offers selected state finalists a \$10,000 undergraduate scholarship. The student application and instructions for applying are available here. Applications must be submitted no later than **Oct. 29.**

During the first nine weeks counselors will meet with seniors to review transcripts, ACT scores, Ready graduate indicators, TN Promise, Hope Lottery scholarships, post-secondary plans, and much more.
