SAT Subject Test Fees: \$26 base fee (per registration) + \$26 (per test) for Language with Listening Tests + \$21 (per test) for ALL other Subject Tests

Test Fee Waivers for Free/Reduced Lunch Participants: if you are a free/reduced lunch program participant, you qualify for 2 fee waivers each for the SAT, SAT Subject Tests, and the ACT. See Ms. Kocian in the LASA college center (room 273) for waiver forms. Taking the SAT or ACT with a waiver form also qualifies you for college application fee waivers!

Reminders

- You are responsible for knowing which standardized tests your college requires. Some require subject tests for admission, while others only recommend them or use them for placement. Identify individual college and program requirements as early as possible.
- If taking the SAT, check score release dates on the College Board website. Most ACT scores are available for online viewing within two weeks after the test date.
- Colleges require official test scores from the testing organizations. Students must contact College Board or ACT to send their test scores directly to each college to which they are applying. Scores are NOT listed on your high school transcript.
- Take advantage of your 4 FREE score reports when registering for these tests (or up to nine days after the test date). Many colleges require that you send all scores anyway so you're saving \$52 (ACT: \$13 per test date per report) and/or \$48 (SAT: \$12 per report) by not having to send them later.
- You can take either the SAT or up to three SAT Subject tests on any test date, but you cannot take both on the same date.
- Note carefully the dates of subject tests: certain subjects are only offered on one or two test dates.
