Students must create the book using each letter of the alphabet to describe a political, economical, geographical, or cultural trait of the country. Students must use each of the letters of the alphabet. The book must contain a picture and description of each letter that represents a political, economic, geographic, or cultural trait and how it pertains to the country.

For example, an ABC book of the United States could include the following: A is for the Appalachian Mountains. The Appalachian Mountains stretch from Alabama to Maine. It is part of the geography of Georgia, South Carolina, Tennessee, Virginia, Kentucky, West Virginia, Pennsylvania, New York, Vermont, and New Hampshire. A picture must be included.

Your book should contain the following:

- A decorated cover with your name, class period, and name of your country.
- Each letter of the alphabet on a separate page.
- An illustration for each word, name or concept. Illustrations can be drawn, traced, copied, cut from magazines, or done on the computer.
- Be consistent throughout your book. Make it as much like a real ABC book as possible. Your grade will be determined by craftsmanship, creativity, thoroughness, and neatness.
