## SUMMER CAMPS

### 4-H Day Camp



This camp is for campers between 6 to 12 years of age. Campers spend 5 FUN days at the Northern Virginia 4-H Ed Center where they participate in morning workshops such as woodworking, rocketry, performing arts, pet care, cooking and fishing. They swim every day and participate in afternoon activities such as a giant game of capture the flag, a talent show, and a carnival. Teen counselors and adult volunteers help lead this exciting camping program.

**When:** M-F, June 10—14, from 9am — 3pm (2pm on Friday)

**Location:** School buses transport campers to the Northern Virginia 4-H Ed Center.

**Cost:** For only \$90 campers will receive a week of FUN, a t-shirt, snacks, project supplies, swimming each day and transportation to and from camp. It is the best deal around!!!

## Culpeper-Shenandoah- Rappahannock-Spotsylvania 4-H Overnight Camp

Nine to 13 year olds will LOVE spending a week at this action-packed camp! Campers arrive Sunday evening and spend the next four days participating in activities such as swimming, canoeing, horse-back riding, performing in the HUGE talent show, and ending each day at the campfire circle. Campers sleep in the dormitories on site.

**When:** Sun—Th, June 23—June 27

**Location:** Northern Virginia 4-H Ed Center in Front Royal, VA

**Cost:** For \$300 campers receive 12 meals, 4 nights of lodging, swimming each day, all project supplies, a t-shirt and one of the best experiences of their lives. A limited number of need based scholarships are available.

**A \$50 nonrefundable deposit is required with each camp registration to secure your spot.**



Youth entering the second grade to thirteen year olds are invited to participate in these all day programs. Come to one or come to all of them! Busing will be provided at various locations throughout the county each morning. Participants will need to be picked up at CCLC at 4pm. Space is limited. The cost is \$25 per trip.

**When:** 9am—4pm

### **July 12: Culpeper-Madison-Rappahannock Farm Show (CMR) and Swimming at Graves Mountain Lodge**

*The morning will be spent at CMR touring the barns and learning about, seeing and touching the many different animals that 4-Hers show and sell at this annual event. The afternoon will be spent swimming at Graves Mountain Lodge.*

### **July 16: Swimming at the Claud A Stokes swimming pool and ice cream at Spelunkers**

*We will play outdoors and enjoy a picnic lunch followed by Spelunkers ice cream before we head to the Claud A Stokes pool in Front Royal, VA for afternoon swimming.*

### **July 23: Route 11 Potato Chip Factory, Luray Zoo and Ice cream**

*Campers will enjoy sampling a variety of Route 11 Potato Chips (all are delicious!) before visiting the Luray zoo. We will end the day with ice cream!*

## REGISTRATION PROCESS:

Registration begins February 1, 2019 at the RCES's Auxiliary Gym at 8am. If there is a snow or weather delay, registration will take place the following week, on Monday, February 4 at 8am at the Extension office.

Registration forms will not be distributed until Tuesday, January 22, and will not be accepted until Feb. 1st when they will be opened in the order they were received. In-person registrations will have priority over those in the mail. Those who are unable to register in-person are encouraged to have someone submit their registrations on their behalf.

## CAMPERS:

Each camper must have a completed registration and a \$50 non-refundable deposit PER CAMP.

In April, campers will be sent a packet with additional details, forms, and class selections for those camps offering classes. Payment/scholarships must be secured by this date in order to receive a camp packet.

**Please note: Registrations are accepted until camps are filled, however, classes are assigned on a first-come first-served basis.** Register early and return your packet of forms quickly to avoid disappointment.

**Please note: There is a returned check fee of \$50.**

## REFUND POLICY:

All refund requests must be in writing.

There will be a \$50 non-refundable processing fee per camp and a \$10 fee per summer one-day programs. The remaining balance will be refunded until May 3. after-which no refunds will be given except in cases of sickness (with a doctor's note) or emergency (evaluated on a case by case basis).
