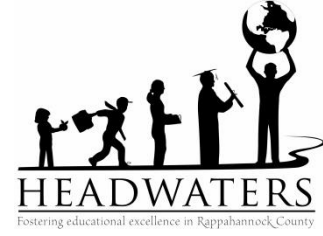

Headwaters invites students entering grades 2-12 in September to take part in the 2019 Headwaters Summer Chorus. For two weeks in June, students will sing and build musicianship skills under the teaching of dedicated music professionals who love to teach choral music and technique. **No prior musical training is required.** Registration is *open to all students entering grades 2-12* regardless of whether they are enrolled in Rappahannock County Public Schools or not.



Senior Choir (grades 5-12)

Students entering grades five through twelve have the opportunity to join the Senior Choir. The Senior Choir sings a variety of different musical styles, from classic choral repertoire to favorite contemporary songs. Students also build choral technique and learn how to become better singers. Students also work on musicianship skills using percussion instruments.

Keith Hudspeth

Keith Hudspeth is a general and choral music educator at Georgetown Day School in Washington, DC, where he currently teaches lower and middle school general music and directs the lower and middle school choruses. In 2007, he completed his Orff Schulwerk Certification at George Mason University and then worked with Steven Calantropio the following summer in a Level IV Master Class. Keith is a vocal specialist, receiving his Bachelor of Music in Voice and K-12 Teacher Certification from the University of North Carolina at Charlotte and a Master of Music in Vocal Performance from Rice University. Additionally, he was a member of various American operatic young artist programs and sang professionally for regional companies before turning his focus toward music education. In 2009, Keith taught one of the supplemental courses at George Mason with a focus on choral programming and performing and presented a middle school reading session at the 2016 ACDA Voices United.

Wendy Aichele

Wendy Anderson Aichele grew up in Pittsburgh's North Hills and graduated in 1971 from Winchester-Thurston School (Pittsburgh, PA). Among the first undergraduate women to attend the University of Virginia in Charlottesville, VA, she majored in music and graduated with honors in 1974. While in graduate school at UVa, she served as the organist at Olivet Presbyterian Church in Owensville, VA as well as the upper school glee club director and the lower and middle school music teacher at St. Anne's-Belfield School in Charlottesville. She completed her Master's degree in music theory at the University in 1977.

Aichele has served numerous churches and musical organizations as pianist, organist, accompanist, and choir director. Since June, 2013 she has served as Minister of Music at Washington Baptist Church in Washington, VA.
