The Grading System

- Letter grades are given each quarter to establish the honor roll, while credit and class rank are based on semester grades.
- A weighted grade point system is used for computation of class rank and grade point average.
- Transfer grades are recorded from transcripts of the sending school and class rank and grade point average are re-calculated based on Williams Bay's weighted grading system.
- Students are ranked in their class starting in grade 9. All subjects except Student Aid, Internship, and Peer Helper are included in the grade point average.

Programs

The school offers additional programs to all students. Special courses include those in our gifted and talented program, junior high acceleration in Math and/or Science, and the Back on Track (BOT) program is available for students at risk for graduation.

Honors Courses

Students at WBHS have the opportunity to take classes at the honors level if they meet the prerequisites for the course. Grades received in honors courses are weighted differently than non-honors courses (see Grading Scale). WBHS currently awards honors credit to the following courses, which are offered based on student demand:

AP Studio Art, AP English, Honors Spanish IV, AP Spanish, Honors Advanced Math, AP Calculus, Honors Chemistry, AP Chemistry, AP Biology, Honors Physics, Honors Social Studies, AP Government, AP US History, AP Psychology

Please note: Students may also elect to take honors and AP courses through our Distance Learning network or another area high school when available. But may not receive honors credit
