An important metropolis by the Roman period, Thessaloniki was the second largest and wealthiest city of the Byzantine Empire and, today, has been designated as a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Paul the Apostle's earliest known letter was written to the early Christian church in Thessaloniki and is identified as First Thessalonians. In addition to its historic roots, Thessaloniki has also been designated by National Geographic as a top tourist destination.
