Requirements for all schools:

- Training for all faculty & staff
- Provide lessons for all students
- Parent education

Lessons for All Students

Law requires that we educate students at **only four selected grade levels** spanning k-12. We chose k-5, 7th and 9th. Our elementary counselors elected to teach the lessons at all grade levels (k-5) due to the critical need at younger years to receive this information and comprehend the concepts needed to maintain personal safety.

Middle school lessons (7th Grade) will be provided by CHIPS. Girls and boys will be separated.

High schools lessons (9th Grade) will be provided by former Jefferson County Family Court Judge, Shelby County Assistant District Attorney and CHIPS. Girls and boys will be separated.
