DO I REALLY HAVE TO READ THIS STUFF?

Yes, you do. Depending on the class you're entering, it will be one or more major test grades for you when you return to school. It will also sharpen your reading comprehension skills and expose you to important works of literature. We also think you will find something enjoyable here as well in selections that have been chosen with an eye to interest as well as quality.

• WHERE CAN I GET THESE BOOKS?

Books-A-Million, the Meridian Public Library, Amazon.com, Books-A-Million.com, Barnes and Noble, etc. While we will notify Books-A-Million of our reading list so they will have the books in stock, there is no "correct" location to purchase these books. Get them from anywhere you can, including borrowing them from previous students.

IS THERE A "CORRECT VERSION" OF THE BOOK?

In some cases, yes. Please check your class information sheet to be sure. If no specific edition is required, then you can use any edition, new or used. Most teachers specify that you make sure you do not get an abridged version of a work.
