Good News

A. <u>Good News – Superintendent José Banda</u>

- ACSD was awarded a three-year Carol M. White PEP (Physical Education Program) Grant from the U.S. Department of Education to initiate, expand, and improve physical education programs. The \$1.7 million grant will fund a PEP coordinator and two P.E. specialists who will train teachers on the Fab 5 physical activity and nutrition curriculum.
- Congratulations to Melbourne A. Gauer School principal Dr. Debbie Schroeder on being named Principal of the Year Silver Medalist in the Spotlight Awards. The Spotlight Awards honor innovative community fitness champions who have positively impacted the physical activity and fitness levels of children.
- Adelaide Price School principal Suzy McMasters hosted a sixth-grade girls' slumber party at the school on Friday night, October 21. The goal of the activity is to help build leadership in young women. Speakers discussed topics such as skin care, healthy eating, and exercise. - Rhythmo, Inc. is holding its sixth annual Anaheim Mariachi Festival "Viva Los Muertos" on Sunday, October 30, at Pearson Park Amphitheater. The event is a fundraiser to help provide music education for approximately 300 District students. The program will feature a performance by ACSD students.

Facilities/Const. Update Β.

- Facilities/Construction Update Superintendent José Banda
 - Abraham Lincoln School Concrete has been poured for several onsite projects. Work continues on structural steel fabrication and onsite work. Crews are currently bolting/welding steel beams and columns and installing the metal roof decking. The installation of electrical conduits and floor boxes in building B are in progress.
 - Clara Barton School Underground utilities, electrical power distribution, concrete foundations, structural wood framing, HVAC, insulation, drywall, epoxy flooring, aluminum store front system, and site grading have all been completed. Roofing, doors, exterior plaster finish, glazing, interior/exterior painting, and site concrete are near completion. Work has begun on the tile walls and flooring, and asphalt paving.
 - James Madison School The value engineering phase is in progress. Temporary housing has been approved by the DSA, and pending Board approval, the site work to prep for temporary classrooms will start at the beginning of November, with arrival of the temporary classrooms to follow.

- Melbourne A. Gauer School The design has been submitted to the Division of the State Architect for final approval and the value engineering phase is in progress. Additional site audits have been scheduled for the beginning of November.
- Thomas Edison School The value engineering phase is in progress and the architect's team is proceeding with the design for the expanded scope of work on building C.
- John Marshall School The design and facilities teams have continued with the schematic design phase details and value engineering has commenced.
- Alexander J. Stoddard School The District's team, architect and engineers have continued the site audits addressing site specific difficulties that require special considerations in the areas of accessibility and HVAC.
