

MINUTES
AUTAUGA COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION
OCTOBER 16, 2018

The Autauga County Board of Education met in a special session on Tuesday, October 16, 2018. Board Vice Chairman Ledronia Goodwin called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m. with all board members present with the exception of Mark Hindman and Jeffrey Keith. Mr. Agee gave the invocation and the Pledge of Allegiance followed.

The agenda for the meeting was approved on a motion by Ms. Ballow, seconded by Mr. Manderson.

On a motion by Ms. Ballow, seconded by Mr. Manderson the board voted unanimously to enter into executive session for approximately thirty minutes under good name and character.

Upon returning from executive session, the superintendent's recommendation that student A from Marbury High School be expelled from the Autauga County School System for a period of 365 days, that the student be trespassed from all school property and all school activities for the period, and that the student be allowed to return to school under strict probation after this period was unanimously approved by the board on a motion by Mr. Manderson, seconded by Ms. Ballow.
