Bears Den Receives New Grant!

The Ava R-1 School District is excited to announce it has been awarded a new 21st Century Community Learning Centers (CCLC) grant. Daily operations will be overseen by the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education. Subsequent years funding is based on availability of funds and satisfactory compliance with grant requirements and performance. This five year grant will allow our current program to expand the afterschool services to all Douglas County students in preschool through eighth grade.

The program will be held on the Ava elementary and middle school campuses. All students will be checked out with the gatekeeper in the elementary building.

A morning program will be offered at the elementary from 6:45 until 8:00 each morning. Students will have the opportunity to join the Morning Walking Club, finish their homework, or have free time before school. At the middle school, the morning program will be open from 7:00 to 8:00. Students in 7th and 8th grade will report to the cafeteria and students in 5th and 6th grade will report to the gym.

The evening program will begin immediately after school and run until 5:45 each evening. Activities will include recess, snacks, tutoring, homework help along with practice on math and reading skills followed by enrichment classes.

The enrichment classes will focus on math and science, use of technology, engineering, arts and crafts, and physical activities



Buses Home

Transportation home will be available with door to door stops in town and designated drop off points similar to summer school. Middle school students staying for athletic practices are welcome to join Bears Den after practice and ride the Bears Den bus home each night. Buses will leave the school at 5:45 p.m. each evening.

Attendance is IMPORTANT! Students attending 30 days will have a field trip in December and our May field trip will require students to have attended Bears Den 60 days or more.

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Fees

The cost of Bears Den is determined by the student's lunch status. Students on free lunches will be charged \$1 per night. Students on reduced lunches will pay \$2 per night. Students on full priced lunches will pay \$3 per night. There is a family cap of \$25 per week. No student or family will be denied services because of financial need. Scholarships are available for students and families who need assistance. Scholarships forms can be picked up at the gatekeeper's table or from the offices.



Running Club

Small Stars Volleyball
