Dear Breckinridge Families,

We are excited to announce that the Breckinridge County School District has been approved to offer Non-Traditional Instruction (NTI) days during the 2018-19 school year. Our plan is to allow for learning to continue when school is not in session. If approved by the Kentucky Department of Education (KDE), an NTI day will count as an instructional day.

An NTI day will occur when the district declares a day when learning and instruction will continue, but students will not report to school. Learning will take place utilizing technology or paper based instruction focusing on improving skill development and an extension of student learning. All the materials will be provided by your child's teacher(s), and students will be expected to return completed assignments to their teacher upon returning to school. Please understand that not every school cancellation day will be an NTI day. The message from the school district will specifically communicate what type of cancellation day it will be.

Students with internet access will be able to complete school work at home or other locations. If your child does not have internet access, a paper copy of assignments will be provided in advance of an NTI day. Other information about NTI assignments will be available on websites, newsletters, and e-communications. The following will occur on NTI days in the school district:

- Teachers will be available to answer questions and help students between 8:00 A.M. and 3:00 P.M. with a lunch break from 11:00 A.M. until 12:00 P.M.
- Teachers will be available by email and will respond to both student and parent questions during the above hours. If email is not a possibility, please contact your child's school to set up a means of communication.
- Completed work needs to be returned to school the first day back from an NTI day.
