Mr. Owens gave an update of upcoming VSBA events, noting the VSBA Annual Conference is scheduled for November 15-17, 2017 in Williamsburg, Virginia. There will be a free webinar on October 24 titled 'A Community Friendly Approach to Wireless Infrastructure'. Mr. Owens also noted that he and Mr. Randy Alvis are on the VSBA Southwest Region Nominating Committee. They nominated Mr. Paul Winstead, of the Bristol Virginia Public School System, as Chairman, of the Southwest Region of the Virginia School Board Association. This will be voted on at the Annual Convention in Williamsburg, VA.

Mrs. Hibbitts gave a calendar update noting, we are on day 35; we haven't missed any days; we are set to dismiss May 14. J. M. Bevins Elementary, Riverview Elementary/Middle and Grundy High will dismiss at 12:00 noon, Friday, October 6 for RAM and Grundy's Homecoming. All schools will dismiss at 12:00 noon on Monday, October 9 for a county-wide open house from 1:00 p. m.–7:00 p.m. This month's enrollment shows we are down 18 students; we were at 2,771 last month and are at 2,753 this month; the budget was built on 2,785. We were at 2,813 in June of 2017 (60 students less) and we

were at 2,892 in June 2016 (139 students less).

Mrs. Hibbitts commended J. M. Bevins Elementary for having the highest attendance at 94.15% and Riverview Elementary/Middle had 93.74%.

Administration presented a resignation for Ms. Lisa Rose, Teacher at Council High School.

Upon motion of Mr. Thompson and seconded by Mrs. McClanahan, the resignation was approved.

Royalwood Associates, Inc. for Raleigh, North Carolina is the contractor. Probes were inserted to check for moisture in the concrete slab and the email received today shows preliminary readings are at 70 and 75, which are in normal standards for moisture. Readings will be taken again the

next day. We should not have to have any more moisture barrier than was originally planned. The project is expected to take eight weeks.

Mr. Thompson and Mr. Owens expressed their appreciation to the Board of Supervisors for providing the funding for the project.

meeting Mrs. Hibbitts and Mr. Owens attended in Russell County. She
noted that we have to choose to participate in October and in
December we have to make a binding election whether to participate
in the Local Insurance. Mrs. Hibbitts said the entire county elected to
participate and sent information to be put in the pool. She said this
will be an option to consider as we move forward to the budget for the
next school year.

Upon motion by Mrs. McClanahan and seconded by Mr. Prater, the Board granted permission for the Administration to place the current coal truck on public auction.

The 1980's truck is rusted out and no longer useable to haul coal. A smaller truck, which also has a short life span, will be used to haul coal to the schools until a replacement can be purchased.
