Mr. Thornbury called to order the April 11, 2017 regular meeting of the Buchanan County School Board.

A moment of silence was observed.

Mr. Thornbury asked Ariel Ratliff to lead the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mrs. Penny McCallum, Director, Virginia Tech Southwest Center Southwest Virginia Higher Education Center, came before the Board to recognize a group of students who visited Virginia Tech on February 27th and 28th. Mrs. McCallum stated that her supervisor at Virginia Tech awarded \$20,000 to the Commonwealth Campus Center to use toward a program for young business women. Mrs. McCallum proposed to use her program for high school students from Buchanan County. When her proposal was not

approved she sought help through donations and received financial funding as well as t-shirts, Virginia Tech basketball tickets, lunch on campus, and funding for a charter bus. Forty-eight junior and senior girls and six chaperones were taken on the two day visit. The students attended a basketball game and toured the campus and discovered different career choices that some stated they had not considered or realized were available. Mrs. McCallum said the group was shown how to submit an application for college not only at Virginia Tech but anywhere. They also learned about financial aid and scholarships. They had some hands on experience at some of the different departments such as the Bio Complex Department and the Math Emporium. Mrs. McCallum said she planned to apply for the program again next year.

Mrs. McCallum also provided information for upcoming events: Kids Tech University for boys and girls ages 9-12 on April 22. She has ten scholarships available for the Kids Tech program; A sixth grade girls conference at Southwest Virginia Community College in November. She added that they have been funded for the third year for the Math Grant with the total for three years being \$563,115 for Math teachers in Buchanan County. An agenda of the summer program for the Math teachers was provided. Mr. Owens expressed his thanks to Mrs. McCallum for all she does for our county.

Mr. Owens briefed the Board on upcoming VSBA events. The Superintendent's Workshop is scheduled for April 13 in Charlottesville. April 26 is the Southwest Region Spring Network Forum at the Southwest Virginia Higher Education Center. He noted that our student's VSBA artwork will be delivered for competition to this meeting. Also, the VSBA/WSBA Hot Topic conference in Wytheville will be held May 3.

Mrs. Hibbitts gave a calendar update stating, today is day 148, we have missed seven days due to inclement weather, we have operated on three 2 hour delays, three 3 hour delays and school is scheduled to dismiss Friday, May 26. regard to the retest being after thirty (30) days. Mr. Gallagher stated that these statements refer to two different situations and it is written correctly. Mrs. Taylor stated this policy covers everything represented by VHSL.

Mr. Prater gave a report from the Personnel Committee, stating that interviews were held recently for the Maintenance Shop, Auto Mechanics Instructor and Math Teacher.

There were three applicants and interviews for the Maintenance Shop vacancy and the committee recommended Mr. Ertley Ward for the position.

Mr. Prater continued with the Auto Mechanics Instructor vacancy. There were four applicants and interviews and the committee recommended Ricky Stacy for the position.

The committee recommended Krystal Cantrell for a Math teacher position among several applicants and interviews.

Mr. Owens seconded the motion from committee to approve all recommendations from the Personnel Committee.

Motion Passed – Mrs. McClanahan abstained.

Mr. Owens stated that he had nothing new from the Building Committee.

Upon motion by Mr. Thompson and seconded by Mr. Harrison, the Board agreed to cover the cost for one test for the Building Engineers to take the certification exam for the International Plumbing Code and/or the Electrical Code.

Motion Passed

Mr. Owens established that the word "consolidation" is a very touchy and controversial word. He stated that Mrs. Hibbitts had given him information from files gathered in 1995, 1996, 1998, 2000 and 2001 that was mostly done in-house. He said he had talked with the Department of Education, the Virginia Association of School Superintendent's and VSBA. He was told that most of the studies that were done on an

outside basis were done with the Office of Planning and Budget in Richmond but their budget was cut in 2015 and they no longer have funding to do this type of work. They suggested he go online and look at the school divisions that had completed consolidation studies. Mr. Owens said he learned that VASS has a team that does this for a price. He stated that while looking online he noticed there were many teams that did this type of study. He added that in talking with the Consolidation Committee; McClanahan and Thompson, they have decided to ask Mrs. Hibbitts to look at, at least three of the firms and report back to the Board. He said he does not want it to be like in the past when someone says, "You can save a million dollars by closing Russell Prater School". He wants actual facts and information that can be verified and presented as true. He said we need to look at more than the money aspect. They want an outside opinion that will be impartial, yet creditable.

Mr. Thornbury stated that he feels the idea is prudent and compassionate and he suggests we move forward with an RFP (request for proposal) for the Board to consider.

Upon motion by Mr. Owens and seconded by Mr. Harrison, the RFP for consolidation was approved.

Motion Passed

On behalf of the Food Service Committee, Mrs. McClanahan thanked Mrs. Sue Cook, Food Service Supervisor, for trying to change the menus and trying to do some seasonal things to make things different for the students this coming year.

Mr. Owens interjected that he had someone who wants to address the Board and present another side of the consolidation situation. He said a good example is if we lose children to another county, we don't need to do it.

The next regular meeting date was set for May 2, 2017.

Upon motion by Mr. Harrison and seconded by Mr. Thompson and Mrs.

McClanahan, the meeting was adjourned at 7:28 p.m.
