

Mr. Owens asked the Board to indulge him by allowing him to express his opinion before voting. He quoted from a hand out entitled 'Consolidation of Schools' that was handed out at the public hearing held at Grundy High School in April, "assume nothing and analyze much when considering consolidation proposals". Mr. Owens stated, "This has not been an easy decision, it has been one of the most difficult I have had to make. I attended a public hearing to consolidate Russell Prater Elementary in 1998, some twenty years ago. We finally did consolidate Russell Prater Elementary after three more public

hearings in 2014. I have always been a proponent of small elementary schools. When I started teaching in Buchanan County in 1976 at Harman Elementary School, we had over 10,000 students; over 800 at Harman Elementary; over 1,000 at Vansant Elementary, where I went two years later. Today, we have 2,726 students, almost 75% less; we had eighteen or nineteen schools, now we have ten; two in the Garden District, two in the Hurricane District, two in the Knox District, and four in the North Grundy District. The Prater, South Grundy and Rocklick Districts have no schools in them now. I have had much discussion and listening to citizens, the Administration, the Finance Department of the State Department of Education on numerous occasions, as well as our Finance Department, before coming to this decision. I didn't want to go with "you will save a \$1,000,000 if you close that school, and I didn't' want to go with you'll save \$0 if you close that school, cause I don't think either one of them are correct. Also, I wanted to look into the personnel effects that might take place which wasn't done when we closed Russell Prater Elementary School. After looking very closely at all the personnel that could be involved at J. M. Bevins and at the other schools and at the number of employees that plan on retiring, guitting, moving, as well as the long-term subs that we presently employ, I feel like this is the best time to consolidate J. M. Bevins Elementary School. I would also add

that the children at J. M. Bevins basically have three choices where they might go, Twin Valley Elementary/Middle, Hurley Elementary/Middle and Riverview Elementary/Middle. With this all being said, I vote "yes" to consolidate J. M. Bevins Elementary School."
