



History

The Mt. Zion Elementary School Annual Report is provided to the stakeholders of Mt. Zion Elementary School as a part of the Continuous Improvement process of the Carroll County School System.

Mt. Zion Elementary School is one of 24 schools that make up the Carroll County School System. The Carroll County School District is primarily a rural district situated approximately 50 miles from Atlanta, Georgia. The district is comprised of five regular high schools, six middle schools, twelve elementary schools, a charter college and career academy, and an alternative school.

Mt. Zion Elementary School serves Pre-Kindergarten through 5th grade students of the Mt. Zion Cluster in the Carroll County School District. After many years, Mt. Zion Elementary School moved into a new building at the present location in November of 2007 with 607 students. Other schools in the Mt. Zion Cluster include Mt. Zion Middle School and Mt. 






























2012-13 School Highlights
