AIG Update

Carol Boaz and Emily Buchanan shared a PowerPoint presentation and gave update on the AIG Program and answered questions of the board.

Mel Battle requested a copy of the information to be broken down by grade levels, sex, race, and school. Mr. Battle also questioned the number of AIG certified teachers. Mrs. Carol Boaz replied an average of 2-3 per grade level and for grades K-2 there are 2-3 at each school except for Stoney Creek who only has one.

Donna Hudson questioned the data that is put in place for identification. Mrs. Boaz replied that EOG scores, grades and much more is considered when identifying students. Mrs. Buchanan has also put in place a very extensive data chart for every grade level. Mrs. Hudson also questioned if the principal and or instructional coaches monitoring the AIG students or are the coaches more of a support role. Mrs. Boaz

replied that teachers make most of these decisions. Mrs. Hudson shared she felt that we need to look at the budget next year for additional support as we need to support these students and noted that Mrs. Donna Kimbro only works two days a week. Mrs. Hudson shared that the information presented was very good and thanked Mrs. Boaz and Mrs. Buchanan for their efforts.

V. SUPERINTENDENT UPDATES

Dr. Carter shared the following:

- Memorandum of Understanding is with the County Commissioners and she has spoken to County Manager Bryan Miller regarding meeting with a small group of two from each Board. She has not heard back from County Manager Bryan Miller as of yet.
- The County Commissioners approved to pull down the \$1.4 Lottery Funds and the paperwork has been submitted. Once the money is pulled down Mr. Hatchett, Maintenance Director, can begin work on the safety vestibules.
- Piedmont Triad Education Consortium Signature Breakfast is scheduled for Friday, March 1, 2019. Oakwood Elementary will be recognized.
- Saturday, March 2, 2019 is Dr. Seuss's birthday. Read across America will take place and Senator Berger will be at South Elementary on Friday to read to students.
