## BUDGET UPDATE

If you followed the recent Georgia Legislative Session, you know that Governor Deal appropriated additional funds for public education in the FY17 budget. The state budget contains an additional \$300 million to "minimize the ongoing austerity reduction to Quality Basic Education Act funding." Governor Deal allowed local school districts flexibility to use these additional funds to eliminate teacher furlough days, increase instructional days, and increase teacher salaries. I wanted to present the budget we are planning with the additional funding: **REVENUE** (estimates):

#### DIFFERENCE (Expenses exceed revenue)

The state has cut our QBE funds every year since 2003. We have lost \$65,496,869 in state funding due to austerity reductions. The Board of Education appreciates your support when these cuts forced us to furlough employees and increase class sizes to maintain jobs for employees and programs/services for students. In FY17 our austerity reduction will be \$1,217,255 (\$2,147,421 less than last year). With additional funding, we can absorb health insurance costs and salary step increases. We can also eliminate furlough days and add additional teaching positions to reduce class sizes. While the budget forecast is good for FY17, I hope this explanation helps you understand that we can't increase salaries this year. The Board is committed to increasing salaries when we are confident that we can sustain the increase; HOWEVER,

the Board of Education wants to show their appreciation to you for your support during the hard times. You have supported difficult decisions through every budget challenge so Catoosa County Public Schools could maintain financial stability. Your salaries have been reduced with furlough days, you haven't had a salary increase for years, and teachers have more students in their classes; however, you have maintained an unwavering commitment to our students and our system. You have worked diligently to maintain our system's reputation for providing an excellent education. The Board of Education appreciates every employee in this system.

To show our gratitude for your hard work and your support during the challenging times, EVERY EMPLOYEE will receive a stipend equivalent to 1% of your base pay in March 2017!
