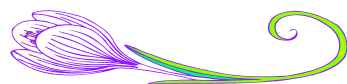

Regular Board Meeting

The Board of Education met at 7:00 p.m. on March 21, 2019, for their regular meeting at Central High School located in Camp Point.

Following the prayer and pledge, President Moore called the meeting to order. Guest present: Megan Ramsey, Senior Class Sponsor, Breanna Bowen, Senior Class Representative, and Athletic Director, Matt Long.

Representative for the Senior Class Breanna Bowen presented the itinerary for the Senior trip to the Board. The Senior Class is requesting permission to go to Kansas City on April 26th and return April 27th. Chaperones will be Megan Ramsey, Kristen Kamprath, Alex Adelman and Marty Cook.

President Moore asked if there were any questions and/or comments from the public. Hearing none, the meeting continued. The current agenda was approved.

Committee Action Items

Building

- The committee met on March 20th.
- There was continued discussion on getting bids to replace some of the floor tiles in the JH hallway. Also, the gym floor at CMS is in need of repair or replacement.

Building Cont.

- The Architect has put out specs for parts of the roof that need to be replaced at the high school. Bids will need to be in board office by April 4th.
- CMS has raised \$19,000 towards new playground equipment.
- Per our 3-year contract, we will continue year 2 of mowing services with our current vendors of Ryan Maas at CES/CMS and Darren Vertrees/Quality Lawn Care at CHS.
- The committee is looking at expanding the JH parking lot to the north.
- There was discussion on purchasing a new pickup truck for the transportation department.

Policy

- The Policy Committee met on March 20th.
- Mr. Cook explained policy 4:190 “Targeted School Violence Prevention Program to the board. He will meet with the building principals soon to discuss setting up a threat assessment team in each building.
