

South Christian Introduces Student-Led Conferences

Student - Led Conferencing is an innovative method of accurately reporting progress of student learning. The communication primarily occurs between the student and parent. Unlike a traditional Teacher/ Parent conference, the Student- Led Conference allows the student to take control of the conversation rather than the teacher. The teacher acts as a facilitator rather than the main messenger of information. In order for the students to conduct the academically focused conversation, they must be familiar with their areas of strengths and their areas of weakness. They must be able to verbalize the standards, concepts, and skills that they are currently working on and where they stand along the progression of mastery. The student is given the opportunity to express set goals, determine timelines, and enact strategies to be used to obtain success. The parent can now hear and see how their child interacts with the curriculum and what their child's role is as the learner. This process ensures that the student is active in deciding next steps and how effort, determination, and commitment play a vital role in their success. South Christian held Student-Led conferences on Tuesday, March 15th. 616 people signed in and participated in the process.
