How is the decision made to cancel school due to inclement weather such as snow or ice?

A: Before making the decision to delay or cancel school due to weather, we rely on critical input from various sources, both district and outside agencies. Throughout the day and night we consult with our Transportation Department about road conditions throughout our county.


When is the decision made to cancel school?

A: In the event that we cancel or delay (including early dismissal) the CCPS Communications Department is contacted immediately and information is shared with the public.

How will the public be informed of the decision?

A: It will be communicated through multiple communications sources. Find out about school closings, delays or early dismissal using these methods:

Local radio & newspaper media, TV news channels 2, 4, 5, & Fox 17, Infinite Campus Messenger Calls (parents & staff only), district and school websites, Facebook and Twitter and the school closing hotline (270) 707-1900.



What is snowSMART Learning?

snowSMART Learning is a non-traditional instruction pro-gram allowing students to continue learning from the home via technology. snowSMART can be utilized on days when students are out of school due to snow/ice, other weather-related closings or widespread illness. When all other op-tions have been exhausted, the Superintendent will decide when days are designated as snowSMART.

We kindly ask students and parents to please keep in mind that snowSMART Learning is a new program. CCPS will continue to look for innovative ways to improve student learning. Feel free to contact your child's principal for questions about the snowSMART Learning program.

Accessing School Assignments

On snowSMART Days, assignments for students can be accessed through Google Classroom and/or by visiting a teacher's classroom website. Communication on student assignments can vary by a student's teacher and/or school. Student login information will be communicated to the student prior to the use of a snowSMART Day. Students will have the option of paper-based assignments. If you are without internet, the local library is a great technology resource.

Accountability and Teacher Availability

Teachers will discuss expectations with students, prior to the use of snowSMART. Students will be required to meet expectations and fulfill assignment requirements on snowSMART Days. Some teachers may communicate via tools such as email or Remind 101. Communication may vary by teacher and/or school. School specific snowSMART plans will be communicated by your child's school. Hours of teacher availability are from 8-11 AM and 12-3 PM.
