SBDM Councils Impact on Student Achievement

School Based Decision Making Councils promote shared leadership among those who have opportunities to impact student success. Membership of each council includes parents, teachers, and an administrator from the school. The council has the responsibility to set school policy and make decisions as outlined in the Kentucky Revised Statutes. SBDM

Council decisions should provide an environment to enhance student achievement and school policy must be consistent with district board policy.

To be eligible to serve on a council, parents must have a student enrolled or pre-registered to attend the school for the year they will be serving on the school council. Elected parents must submit to having a background check and a CAN (child abuse and neglect) Check. The definition of parent is defined to include parent, step-parent and/or a person who has legal custody of a student pursuant to a court order and with whom the student resides.


Career & College Videos Bring the Future to CCPS Students
