

### MESSAGE FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT

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In an effort to gain important information that could impact our district, School Board Members and I recently attended the Kentucky School Board Association Conference. As you might imagine, there was a lot of discussion centered on the Charter School Bill(s). The charter school concept has been defined by many groups with various outcomes. We anxiously await the final results; however, we want you to know that we have provided input and we are monitoring the legislation closely.

Senate Bill 1 will define our new accountability system. Last year at this time we collected input from our principals, assistant principals and other stakeholders in order to respond to Commissioner Pruitt's request for feedback on the new accountability system. We shared this information with Commissioner Pruitt at one of his Town Hall Meetings. I believe the Commissioner has considered our thoughts and keeps in regular contact with legislators to share information. Many of the concerns we raised are being addressed. Recently, Dr. Pruitt announced another round of Town Hall Meetings (as important as the one last year). Once again he invites us to share our thoughts and ideas. A full listing of Town Hall Meetings dates, locations and times, are listed on the KDE website. Our district will have representation at one of the meetings again this year. We haven't confirmed a specific date/location, but we will keep you posted. I hope parents, community members, teachers, students and all concerned citizens will be a part of our representation.

As you know, the TELL Survey is scheduled March 1-31<sup>st</sup>. This is a great opportunity for certified educators to provide anonymous feedback on working conditions in our district. Thank you in advance for your participation in the survey. Four years ago we used the TELL Survey Results to develop a technology plan to better serve you. We certainly appreciate your feedback.

#### Where will my child attend school?

You can find out which school your child will attend for the upcoming school year by using the School Site Locator found on the district's website: www.christian.kyschools.us.

### What do I need to bring to register my child for Kindergarten?

Several items of documentation are needed before a child can be enrolled in school.

Proof of residency is needed for student enrollment. Parents/guardians should bring 1 item from section A and 2 items from section B (see below).

A: A copy of current lease, deed, or tax bill

B: A copy of current KY driver license, documented government assistance, current electric, water, cable, cell phone bill and/or auto insurance statement

Please provide the following medical information/documentation during the time of registration:

- Physical exam\*
- Vision exam\*
- A current Kentucky Immunization Record\*
- Dental Exam\*
- State certified copy of birth certificate (no hospital copies will be accepted) or other reliable proof student's identity and age with an affidavit explaining the inability to show copy of birth certificate
