

The KY-951 Marksmanship Team concluded their inaugural season this past March. Coach Major Marlow is proud to say they exceeded expectations for a first year team. The team placed in the "Top-6" in all four competitions this year, with two 3rd & two 6th place team finishes respectively. These competitions helped prepare them for the Air Force National Preliminaries. Starting with 458 Air Force teams, they finished 13th and earned a "National Invitation" to the North Regional in Port Clinton, Ohio. Before Air Force Nationals, the team traveled to Hendersonville for the

"All-Service" Championships, and brought home the "Runner-Up" trophy and the highest finish for an Air Force team in the state of Kentucky. This confidence carried over into the National Arena as they finished 3rd in the North Region, and 23rd in the Nation. This is the beginning, said Coach Marlow, next year we will build on this success and hopefully reach the next step, "All-Service Nationals."

New Apprenticeship Program Available for Christian County Students

On April 21 at the Christian County Board of Education meeting, Larry Dean, Global Director of HR for White Drive announced an exciting new partnership between White Drive, the Chamber of Commerce, Christian County Public Schools, Gateway Academy, and Hopkins-ville Community College. The program, called TRACK (Tech Ready Apprentices for Careers in Kentucky), will offer high school students an opportunity to compete for high-skill, high-wage Apprenticeship Positions with White Drive in the areas of Machining and Industrial Maintenance. There are four positions available for the 2016-2017 school year. Applications will be available at Gateway Academy. The four students earning the Apprenticeship positions will attend classes for part of the day and go to their job for part of their day beginning in the junior year. After graduation, students will have a modified schedule that includes earning an Associate degree from HCC while remaining employed with White Drive. The goal is for the apprentice to earn a full-time, high-wage career with White Drive.
