Dear Parents and Community Members,

Dear Parents/Guardians and Community Members,  
In the 2014-15 school year, Clatskanie Middle High School (CMHS) did not receive a rating for the Overall State Rating system. This is due to the US Department of Education allowing the State of Oregon to temporarily suspend the assignment of school ratings while schools transition from the OAKS to the Smarter Balanced Assessment. The results of the Smarter Balanced Assessment showed CMHS students tested better than the state average for English Language Arts and below the state average for Mathematics. This is a direct reflection of how students performed in the OAKS. The Smarter Balanced Assessment will be replacing the OAKS and is

working to develop next-generation assessments that accurately measure student progress toward college and career readiness.

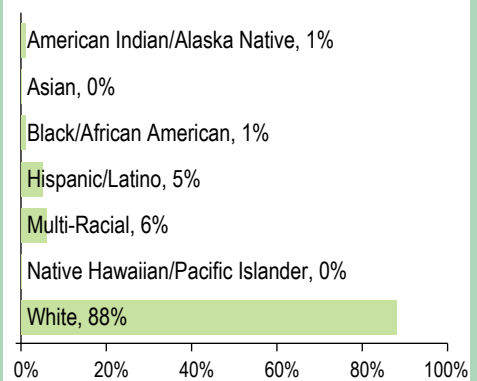

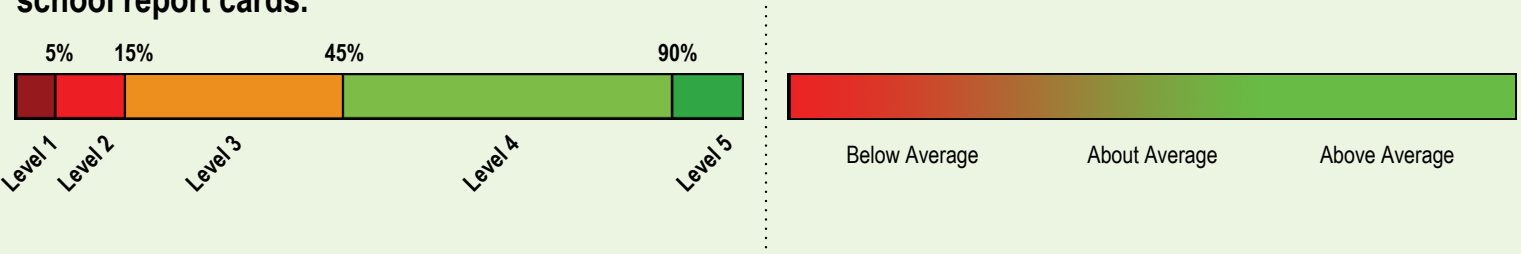

**CURRICULUM & LEARNING ENVIRONMENT** WHAT IS THIS SCHOOL DOING TO IMPROVE STUDENT LEARNING AND TO PREPARE STUDENTS FOR THE FUTURE?

<b>SCHOOL READINESS</b>	<p>CMHS is improving student learning in mathematics by providing opportunities for students to excel in academics through advanced math courses as well as improving foundational skills for students who are not succeeding in Algebra 1 by taking a course that assists students mathematics skills and receive direct one on one instruction.</p>	<p>Students at CMHS are being prepared for the future through career and college readiness course work. CMHS offers a wide variety of electives that prepare students for the work force as well as a variety of advanced course work to prepare for college.</p>

## CURRICULUM & LEARNING ENVIRONMENT CONTINUED . . .

### ACADEMIC SUPPORT

Students are able to receive additional support in mathematics by taking a high school math lab class to help students practice, gain knowledge, and enhance their foundational mathematics skills. CMHS offers students online course work to recover credits. Teachers have dedicated office hours twice a week after school for students to receive one on one instruction, re-take proficiencies, or have extra support. Once a month, students are given a forty-five minute block of time as a study hall during the school day to make up assignments and tests, or be able to receive help from the teachers. The staff at CMHS has dedicated time to communicate to parents/guardians about the progress or struggles students are having in the classroom.

### ACADEMIC ENRICHMENT

CMHS students are able to enrich their academics through advanced course work, dual-credit, college courses, advanced placement courses through online learning, and independent studies. Students are recognized for their hard work and effort through student recognition programs, honor roll, and scholarships.

### CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION

Clatskanie High School was able to partner with a neighboring school district to receive the CTE revitalization grant. Through the grant CHS was able to create a woods processing course where students were able to learn to use a saw mill and mill their own lumber. The lumber was used in the middle school woods shop. The middle school woods shop built bird houses with the lumber for the high school environmental science class to enhance their learning about birds. CMHS offers a wide variety of CTE courses: Health Occupations (1 & 2), art, photography, metals, small engine repair, woods processing, wood shop, and forestry.

### EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

CMHS has enhanced their extracurricular activities. Currently students may participate in a wide range of athletics. Students also have several activities to choose from: Forestry, Speech and Debate, Drama, Band, Choir, National Honor Society, Key Club, Spanish Club, Student Council, Yearbook, and HOSA.

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
