**Ripley's Aquarium** – Make your adventure with thousands of sea animals and activities for the whole family at our aquarium. Adults (12 and up) \$39.95, Children (3-11) \$24.99. Hours of operation: Open 365 days a year 8:30 am – 11 pm.

**Wonder Works** – This amusement park is for the mind with 50,000 square feet of "edu-tainment." The attraction includes exhibits that challenge the mind and spark the imagination. Adult (12 and up) \$39.95, Children (3 - 11) \$24.99. Hours: Monday – Friday 9 am – 5 pm, Sunday 11 am – 5 pm.

**The Charleston Museum** – One of the oldest museums in the United States with a highly-regarded collection including historic artifacts, natural historic decorative arts and two historic Charleston houses. Adults (18+) \$12, Youth (13-17) \$10, Children (3-12) \$5. Hours of operation Monday – Friday 9 am – 5 pm, Sunday 11 am – 5 pm.

**Carriage Tours** – Discover more of Charleston on a public carriage ride. Adult \$28, Youth (4-11) \$18. Hours of operation: During Daylight Savings Time residential tours operate 9 am – 5 pm. The rest of the year we operate 9 am – 4 pm. Evening tours may be available depending on demand.

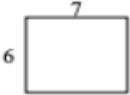
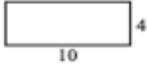
