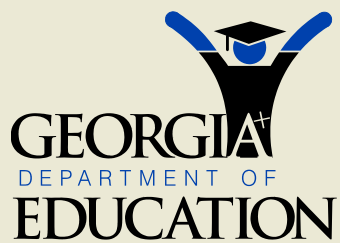

Measurable Goals:

1. Increase the percentage of students meeting or exceeding standards on the Writing portion of the GHSGT to 96%.
2. First-time test takers in Coordinate Algebra will increase the percentage meeting or exceeding standards on the GA Milestones to 45%, a 5% increase over last year.
3. First-time test takers in Geometry will increase the percentage meeting or exceeding standards on the GA Milestones to 30%, a 5% increase over last year.
4. First-time test takers in Economics will increase the percentage meeting or exceeding standards on the GA Milestones to 78.5%.
5. First-time test takers in U. S. History will increase the percentage meeting or exceeding standards on the GA Milestones to 75%.
6. First-time test takers in Physical Science will increase the percentage meeting or exceeding standards on the GA Milestones to 82%.
