

Building Reading Comprehension



Re-Read

- Good readers reread a piece several times. Rereading is simple and effective.

Make Connections

- Text-to-Text: Does the story relate to another story you have read? What characters from other stories remind you of character in current story?
- Text-to-Self: How can you relate to this story? Have you felt like the character before?
- Text-to-World: How does this story relate to a 'current event'?

Summarize

- What are the main ideas in the chapter or story?
- Can you describe what happened in this story or chapter in three sentences?

Predict

- What do you think will happen next?
- What do you think X will do next?
- How do you think the problem will be resolved? Why do you think so?
- What did you read in the story that lead you to this prediction?

Visualize

- Describe the setting (close your eyes).
- What does X look like?
- Sketch a descriptive reading passage.

Clarify/Ask Questions

- Encourage your child to ask questions when confused about a character or plot.
- What just happened?
- Why did X behave that way?

Listen to your child read everyday!
Reading is Knowledge. Knowledge is Power!
