

A Guide to Concentrations Available in the Interdisciplinary Studies Major

This list is applicable to both Adult Degree Program and Interdisciplinary Degree Program students. Students will choose one concentration. The choice should be made in conjunction with the students' educational goal and selected disciplines, and should be made under the guidance of an interdisciplinary studies advisor.

- **Administrative Sciences (B.S.):** a concentration composed primarily of course work from business and related fields, such as communication, information technology, etc.
- **Applied Sciences (B.S.):** a concentration composed primarily of course work from the sciences and technical disciplines.
- **Applied Arts (B.A.):** a concentration composed primarily of course work from the fine arts and humanities, but might include scientific or technical course work as well.
- **Community Services (B.A.):** a concentration composed primarily of course work from the social sciences (especially political science and criminal justice), education, or health-related disciplines.
- **Human Services (B.A.):** a concentration composed primarily of course work from the social sciences (especially psychology and sociology), education, or health-related disciplines.
- **Liberal Studies (B.A.):** a concentration composed primarily of course work from the humanities and social sciences to meet the unique demands of personal or professional growth.
- **Professional Development (B.S.):** a concentration composed primarily of course work suited to the unique demands of a particular career path.
