Practical Nursing (PN) Admission Requirements

Minimum admission standards for the Practical Nursing Program include:

- Unconditional admission to Alabama Southern.
- Receipt of completed application for the Practical Nursing Program by March 1st for Fall entry and November 1st for Spring entry.
- Receipt of high school transcript or copy of GED certificate and all prior official college transcripts.
- Minimum of 2.5 GPA (based on the last 24 credit hours) for students with previous college work.
- Minimum of 2.5 high school GPA for students without prior college work (GED acceptable).
- Student must be eligible for English 101, Math 116, and Anatomy & Physiology I (BIO 201) as determined by college policy.
- Good standing with Alabama Southern.
- Meeting the essential functions or technical standards required for nursing.
- TEAS® Test (Test of Essential Academic Skills) is required for admission.

Admission to the Alabama Southern Practical Nursing Program is competitive, and the number of students is limited by the number of faculty and clinical facilities available. Meeting minimal requirements does not guarantee acceptance. After meeting all requirements, applicants are rank-ordered using a point system based on TEAS® Test Scores, Quality points from selected college (i.e. ENG 101, MTH 116, BIO 201) or high school curricula (i.e. Algebra II, highest level Biology, Chemistry). Additional points will be awarded for students currently enrolled or for students who have previously completed college credits.
