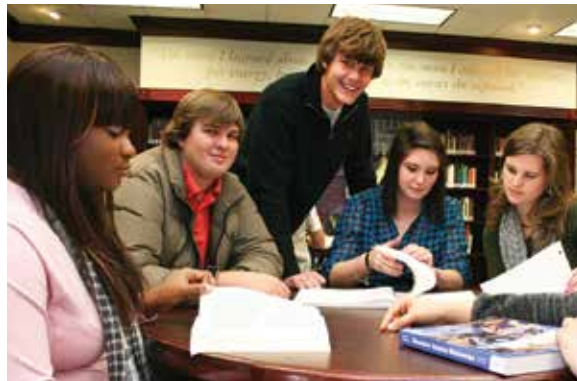
History:

The Alabama State Board of Education, through the consolidation of Patrick Henry State Junior College and Hobson State Technical College, created Alabama Southern Community College on August 22, 1991. Act No. 93 of the Alabama Legislature in 1963 created each of the originating colleges. The first classes on the Monroeville campus were begun in December 1965. Patrick Henry was initially accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) Commission on Colleges in December 1970 and was reaffirmed in 1974 and 1985. Hobson State was initially accredited by SACS Commission on Occupational Education Institutions in December 1972 and was reaffirmed in 1977, 1982, 1987 and 1992. Alabama Southern was accredited by the SACS Commission on Colleges on June 19, 1992 and reaffirmed in 1995 and 2006.

Alabama Southern Community College is a rural, multi-campus, comprehensive community college serving an approximate 5,000-square-mile area of southwest Alabama. The college has campuses located in Monroeville, Thomasville, Gilbertown, and Jackson and serves a five-county district: Choctaw, Clarke, Marengo, Monroe and Wilcox.

Students:

- 1,321 students enrolled for Fall 2012
- 62% of students are female
- 46% of students are minority
- 62% are enrolled full time
- 98% are Alabama residents
- 86% of students receive financial aid
- Median age of students: 20 years old
- 72% of degrees/awards were in career/technical fields for the 2011-2012 academic year
- Awarded 278 students with Associate in Arts Degrees, Associate in Science Degrees, Associate in Applied Science Degrees, and Certificates in Cosmetology, Practical Nursing, Machine Tool Technology, and Welding Technology

Capital Improvements and Economic Impact:

- The impact of Alabama Southern Community College on the local economy is approximately \$23 million for 2011-12 fiscal year
- Operational Budget for 2012-13: \$24 million
- Annual payroll for 2012-13: \$11 million
- Alabama Southern employs 211 people from the community, 127 full-time; 84 part-time
- \$6.8 million in student scholarships, federal grants, and state student grants for 2012-13 academic year
