#### **Operations**

Board approved purchase of HVAC for Bright Star Elementary.

- renovation of old gym at Lithia Springs High School
- addition of classrooms and cafeteria renovation at Lithia Springs Elementary
- relocation from Mirror Lake Elementary to CCI and reassembly of a 10 classroom modular building
- painting at Factory Shoals Middle School and Mt. Carmel Elementary

#### **Finance**

Board discussed the possibility of implementing a pilot program with a software vendor that will help the system maximize FTE funding.

#### **Policies**

Board approved changes to Board Policy GBA: Professional Personnel Compensation and Contracts. Beginning with the 2017-2018 school year, the placement of all certified employees on the salary schedule shall be based on training and experience as well as satisfactory performance as indicated by the annual evaluation. Satisfactory performance based on the Teacher Keys Effectiveness System (TKES) and Leader Keys Effectiveness System (LKES) will be a final rating of "Proficient" or "Exemplary." Satisfactory performance using a job specific evaluation will be a final rating of "Satisfactory."
