 - 4 Sight testing Diagnostic/Progress Monitoring
 - KinderCorner Reading SOLOs Assessments (SFA)
 - Roots Assessments (SFA)
 - Scholastic Reading Inventory (SRI)
 - DIBELS
 - Scientifically based researched basal series used at all grade levels
 - Flexible grouping movement and instruction driven by test data
 - Use assessment data to chart progress and drive instruction
 - Establish baseline instructional level using data derived from PSSA and other relevant assessments
 - Professional Development
 - Extended day/Extended year programs including a Leadership Component and an Academic Component
 - Standards Based Bulletin Boards
 - Provide Parent and Family Nights to encourage partnering for student success
- 2. Hold parent-teacher conferences annually during which the jointly developed compact and other Title I program documents will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's achievement. Specifically, those conferences will be held:
 - Fall conference to discuss the Title I program components
 - Spring conference to review/update Title I documents, and to prepare for following school year by complete the parent survey.
- 3. Provide parents with frequent reports on their children's progress. Specifically, the school will provide reports as follows:
 - The district will provide Report Cards

- Informal progress will be reported as necessary
